




Retail sector as an employer

- Retail is the third biggest employer in Germany
- More than 300.000 companies
- More than 3 Mio. employees
- More than 150.000 in vocational training
- Parttime work above average (about 62%)
- Retail is a female branch (about 70%)


Retail sector is an economic factor

- Continuous sales growth since 2010
- Turnover now more than 500 Billion Euros
- Branch is dominated by SME's (94% have less than 20 employees), but 79% of turnover is generated by enterprises with more than 20 employees
- Online sales are growing faster than stationary sales

HDE forecast +2%




Online sales (net) in Germany +10% in 2018



Collective bargaining in the retail sector

- HDE is sole employers association for the retail sector in Germany
- 30% of companies, 40% of employers are bound by collective agreements with ver.di (trade union for the retail sector)
- Germany has 16 Federal states the retail sector has 16 bargaining committees, coordinated by HDE
- Decentralized elements lead to (slightly) different wages and regulations (e.g. working time) in different states



Collective bargaining in the retail sector

- Regulations about pay groups, wages, weekly hours of work, annual leave, retirement provisions etc.
- Weekly hours of work between 37,5 and 39 hours
- German minimum wage is about 1.440 Euro
- Average wage (salesperson) is about 2.500 Euro
- Minimum annual leave by law is 20 days
- Annual leave in retail sector is 30 days
